David Moore

After graduating in French Language and Literature, David joined the Diplomatic Service in 1968. He served in the Foreign and Commonwealth Office and, following a nine month course at the Ecole Nationale d'Administration, at the British Embassy in Paris.

After transferring to the Department of Trade and Industry (DTI) in 1980, he served in various posts dealing with European and international aspects of trade policy and radio-communications and, on secondment to the Civil Service College, with the Franco-British training exchange programme.

Following three years at the Monopolies and Mergers Commission, David was appointed in 1994 to head the DTI unit responsible for UK policy on industrial aspects of the European Research and Development Programmes. From early 2000 until the end of 2002, he served as Secretary of The Queen's Awards Office, managing the scheme of awards for outstanding business achievement.

From 2003 to 2011 he continued to work on The Queen's Awards on a part-time basis, as Secretary to the Prime Minister's Advisory Committee for the Awards. In 2004 he was a member of the working group which established a new award for individuals, The Queen's Award for Enterprise Promotion, and assessed nominations for this award until 2011.
